ST. ALBAN PRO MARTYR OF BRITAIN



On Friday, we shall celebrate the Feast of St. Alban, our first English martyr. St. Alban was a pagan soldier in the Roman Army stationed in Verulamium, modern day St. Albans. His exact background is unknown, but popular tradition declares him a native Britain.

The venerable Bede says he lived during the religious persecutions of the Emperor Diocletian around the year AD30.

During these dangerous times Alban sheltered a priest named Amphibalus and was so struck by his devotion and blameless life that he became a Christian. The local governor hearing about the priest sent soldiers to arrest him. Alban, seeing them arrive, threw the long cloak of the priest over his own head and shoulders and presented himself to the soldiers as the priest. He was arrested and brought before the governor. When the cloak was removed, it was revealed that he was not the priest the governor ordered Alban to sacrifice to the pagan gods or to suffer death. St. Alban steadfastly refused to do so.

Then the governor asked, who he was "I am Alban and if you desire to know what is my religion, I shall tell you - I am a Christian and am bound by Christian obligations." Then the governor said, "If you wish to enjoy eternal life, sacrifice to the great gods." Alban replied, "The sacrifices you offer are to no avail." The governor ordered Alban to be scourged, hoping to shake his faith. But he bore the pain patiently and joyfully for our Lord's sake.

When the governor saw that he could not change Alban's will, he ordered him to be put to death. On his way to his execution, on 20th June, the martyr had to cross a river. There, St. Bede said, "He saw a multitude of people of every age and rank, the crowd was so large he could not cross the bridge. Then Alban, eager to accomplish his martyrdom, went down to the stream and as he drew near, it dried up, making a way for him to pass over." He was led up a hill outside the town, covered with flowers, followed by a large crowd.

However, when the time came, the executioner refused to kill him. He threw down his sword and confessed himself a Christian. Another man was detailed to carry out the execution and both Alban and the Christian executioner were decapitated together.

St. Alban's body was buried in the adjoining cemetery. When Christianity was legalized by the Emperor Constantine, not long afterwards, a church was built over his tomb which became the Abbey of St. Albans. The town being later re-named in his memory.

Interestingly, our founder Alexander Raphael was M.P. for St. Albans. He decided to build for the Catholic of St. Albans an exact replica of St. Raphael's dedicated to the martyr. Unfortunately he died before the church was completed and the unfinished building was sold to the Church of England. It then became known as 'Christ Church' Anglican Church. Although, no longer a place of worship, the building can still be seen in Verulam Road. The exterior is identical to our own Parish Church.
