S.S. THOMAS MORE & JOHN FISHER

Thomas More's belief that no lay ruler has jurisdiction over the Church of Christ cost him his life.

Beheaded on Tower Hill in London, on the 6th July 1535, he steadfastly refused to approve Henry VIII's divorce, remarriage and establishment of the Church of England.

Despite what the phantomist Hilary Mantel says about him in her discredited book 'Wolf Hall', More the supreme diplomat and counsellor, did not compromise his own moral values in order to please the king. Henry himself realized this and tried desperately to win his chancellor to his side because he knew More was a man whose approval counted, a man whose personal integrity no one questioned. But, when Thomas resigned as chancellor unable to approve the two matters that meant most to Henry, the king had to get rid of Thomas More. He was committed to the Tower of London to await trial for treason. Upon conviction, More declared he had all the councils of Christendom and not just the council of one realm to support him in the decision of his conscience.

Thomas More was a good man described by those at time as "a man for all seasons," He was a literary scholar, eminent lawyer, gentleman, father of four children and chancellor of England. An intensely spiritual man.

Four hundred years later in 1935, Thomas More was canonized a saint of God. Few saints are more relevant to our time. In the year 2000 in Pope Saint John Paul II named him patron of political leaders.

John Fisher was a man of learning, associated with the intellectuals and political leaders of his day. He was interested in the contemporary culture and eventually became chancellor at Cambridge and was made a bishop at the age 35.

In 1521 he was asked to study the question of Henry VIII's marriage. He incurred Henry's anger by defending the validity of the king's marriage with Catherine of Aragon and later by rejecting Henry's claim to be the supreme head of the Church of England.

Like Moore he was sent to the Tower of London, where he remained for 14 months without trial.

The king, further angered that the pope had made John Fisher a cardinal, had him brought to trial on the charge of high treason. He was condemned and executed, his body left to lie all day on the scaffold and his head hung on London Bridge.

Today many questions are raised about Christians' and priests' active involvement in social issues. John Fisher remained faithful to his calling as a bishop. He strongly upheld the teachings of the Church the very cause of his martyrdom was his loyalty to Rome. At the same time he was involved in the political struggles of his time. This involvement caused him to question the moral conduct of the leadership of his country. "The Church has the right, indeed the duty, to proclaim justice on the social, national and international level, and to denounce instances of injustice, when the fundamental rights of man and his very salvation demand it" (Justice in the World, 1971 Synod of Bishops).

Erasmus said of John Fisher: "He is the one man at this time who is incomparable for uprightness of life, for learning and for greatness of soul." He was canonised with Thomas More by Pope XI in 1935
