#### PARISH PRIEST'S SURGERY

Among the most popular short stories of all time is the one in today's Gospel. We know it as the story of "The prodigal Son". It might better be called the story of "The Loving Father". He is the main character and real hero. The younger son asks for his inheritance which was within his rights under the Law but the son's coming to him like this was tantamount to saying that he wished his father dead. Nevertheless his father consented.

The son – because of immaturity, or selfishness, or irresponsibility, or a spirit of adventure, or whatever motivated the youth – chose to go his own way independent of his father. Opting for the pleasure of self-satisfaction, when he had lost everything and was reduced to taking care of pigs, the lowest of the low for a Jew, like an alcoholic who has hit rock-bottom he finally came to his senses and decided to return home.

All the long way home he rehearsed a speech that he hoped would persuade his father to take him back – not as a son any more, but a hired hand.

The average human father might welcome him back, but with a stiff warning - tow the line or else! Yes he would love him however, such a son would have to prove himself before the father could really forgive or forget.

What did this father do? Even as his son was far off, he saw him approaching - he must have been waiting and watching all that time. He threw open his arms in welcome and never let his son finish his rehearsed speech.

The father's forgiveness was total. He ordered his workers to dress his son in the finest robe as a sign of honour, a ring as a sign of authority and shoes as a sign that he continued to be a son not a servant or slave. At that time slaves did not wear shoes. Many would have said of the father, "The old fool! No wonder his son is such a spoiled brat! The old man will be dead of a heart attack in a year!" But if we were put in the place of having to deal with our own best beloved, it might be a different story.

During the celebration that followed, the elder son makes his entrance for the climax of the story. He is smug in having done his duty to the father all the time his brother was away. His judgement, coming from a mentality of law rather than grace, of a hireling rather than a loving son, are rash, his speech mean. Just as the father had graciously cut off the humiliating speech of his younger son to show forgiveness, the elder brother cuts off the loving speech of his father to object. He refers to his younger brother as "your son" and the father gently rebukes him by referring to "your brother"

Isn't the sin of the elder son far greater than all the sins of the prodigal son? He couldn't forgive his own brother. He couldn't rejoice with his father who was so happy to have his son back. We can all identify also with this elder son. How many times have we been jealous, envious, and angry because God gave someone else what we thought was due to us?

But the parable is not about either one of these sons. It is about the father. It is more about the father's unconditional love than the sins of his sons. It is about our heavenly Father who loves us unconditionally with a love we can never earn or be worthy of - who loves us not because of what we are but because of who he is. It is all about the fidelity of the love of God. It is all about the divine mercy.
