Sunday the 29th May is the feast of Corpus Christi. Our annual procession of the Blessed Sacrament will take place at the end of the 11.30am Mass on that day. Followed by refreshments.



This afternoon 24 children from our Parish will make their 1st Holy Communion, please remember them in your prayers. Congratulations to all of them for all their hard work and study over the last months. Many thanks to our three catechists - Ginette, Kate and Chuzzy. Thank you also to all those who have helped with this afternoon's mass, as well as the refreshments afterwards.

The children will return to the church in their 1st Holy Communion finery to lead our Corpus Christi Procession on the 29th May. Our First Holy Communion is one of the holiest and most important occasions in our life. It is the first time that we receive the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist, the body and blood of Jesus Christ.

"The Eucharist is such a great gift. That's why going to Mass is so important. Going to Mass not just to pray, but to receive Communion, the body of Christ. It saves us, forgives us and it makes us one with the Father. How beautiful! The Eucharist is more than just a mere feast. It's a way to remember Jesus' Passover, a mystery that's central to our salvation. But when we talk about 'remembering' that doesn't mean that it's just a memory. It means that every time we celebrate this Sacrament we become part of the Mystery of His Passion, Death and Resurrection. The Eucharist is the peak of God's Salvation.

Dear friends, we don't ever thank the Lord enough for the gift He has given us in the Eucharist! It is a very great gift and that is why it is so important to go to Mass on Sunday. Go to Mass, not just to pray, but to receive Communion, the bread that is the Body of Jesus Christ who saves us, forgives us, unites us to the Father. It is a beautiful thing to do! And we go to Mass every Sunday because that is the day of the resurrection of the Lord. That is why Sunday is so important to us. In this Eucharist - we feel this belonging to the Church, to the People of God, to the Body of God, to Jesus Christ. We will never completely grasp the value and the richness of it."
